RYA Sailability - Sailing Site Guide - FAQ



Who are Sailability?

RYA Sailability is the Royal Yachting Association charity supporting people with disabilities and offering ways for them to get afloat. RYA Sailability are compiling a database of organisations able to offer opportunities to get afloat. The majority of these organisations will then be listed in the Sailing Site Guide.

I can only provide opportunities to those that can help themselves. Does this exclude me?

Not at all, there are several different categories of disability. Not everyone with a disability requires help. Sometimes all that is required is an adjustment of what you ask them to do or the time that it takes to do it.

What is a 'disability'?

Someone with a disability need not necessarily be confined to a wheelchair requiring assistance. There are many different categories of disability from Ambulant, a person with a disability that does not greatly affect their mobility, to Non-ambulant (assisted) someone in a wheelchair who needs assistance in the activities of daily living, and everything in between as well as visual/hearing impairments and learning disabilities. At present there are a lot of service personnel who are incredibly fit but may have lost a limb or part of their sight or hearing but would love the chance to get afloat. What training do I need to take disabled sailors out sailing?

You require no training, however Sailability offer disability awareness training which can help with your understanding and approach to working with some disabilities. Further details available here:

What is foundation status and how can I get it?

RYA Sailability approves sailing sites around the UK for the accessibility of their shore based facilities. Once approved, they receive Sailability Foundation status which can lead to new funding streams. More information is available by contacting RYA Sailability or online:

Do I need to convert my boat?

Not necessarily, it depends on the level of the disability that you feel comfortable taking out. You may only need to make modifications to the way you communicate or in the way you organise the boat. Alternatively you may offer lifts and wheelchair strapping points, if you can cater for Non-ambulant. RYA Sailability have lots of

How can I assess what types of disability I can take out?

I provide motor or power boat trips, can I be involved?

Yes, RYA Sailability is about giving people with disabilities the opportunity to get afloat. Tasters such as this are a great way of getting people on the water.

How can Sailability help?

What does it cost?

To be listed on the RYA Sailability database and have the opportunity to appear in the Sailing Site Guide and website is free. There may be some cost involved in adapting boats and procedures, if required, however RYA Sailability are able to advise on any grants or funding available to assist with this. You are not expected to get disabled people afloat for free, normal course fees would still apply.
